Receives Civilian Meritorious Award

Ms. Carrie Lynch began her internship at Naval Sea Warfare Center (NSWC) Dahlgren Division, Coastal Systems Station (CSS) Panama City, FL in June of 2001. While on her last rotation at Patuxant Naval Air Station she was assigned to the Helicopter Tactical Wing, U.S. Atlantic Fleet. In support of this program office Ms. Lynch located a misdirected Electronic Control Assembly (ECA) valued at more than \$100,000 and increasing Fleet Airborne Mine Countermeasures material readiness. This effort allowed Ms. Lynch to begin her career for the NAVSEA in 2004 by achieving national distinction - the Navy Meritorious Civilian Service Award.

Ms Lynch said "she had begun her internship with a lot of supply training by having started out at NAVICP", referring specifically to the Naval Inventory Control Point located in Mechanicsburg, PA.
